Beyond the Reunion

As you plan your reunion weekend in Kansas City, consider adding an extra day or two to your visit. There are a multitude of interesting, nationally renowned attractions in the Kansas City area including the following.

The World War Museum at Liberty Memorial, (www.worldwar.org), provides an extraordinary experience. The state-of-the-art Museum gives you the chance to explore and discover the nation's most extensive assembly of artifacts, photography and art and narratives of the Great War ever presented in a single collection. The Museum introduces the war in unprecedented ways – through visual and audio sensory stimulation to mold an unforgettable experience in the minds of all visitors – young and old. This is a must see in Kansas City.

Arabia Steamboat Museum, (<http://www.visitkc.com/member-details/index.aspx?id=28981>), is home to a true time capsule of frontier life in the 1800s. The Arabia was headed up the Missouri River in the fall of 1856 when she struck a tree snag and sank just north of Kansas City. Her cargo hold was full of 200 tons of supplies bound for general stores and pioneer settlements. As the years passed, the river changed course and left the Arabia buried beneath a Kansas cornfield. Finally, in 1988 a group of modern-day adventurers uncovered the lost Arabia and her magnificent cargo. They were amazed to find fine dishware, clothing, and even bottled food all preserved in remarkable condition. Their find has been called the King Tut's Tomb of the Missouri River. So, if you're looking for an adventure your whole family will enjoy, discover the treasures of the steamboat Arabia.

American Jazz Museum, (<http://www.americanjazzmuseum.com>), focuses on the preservation, exhibition and advancement

After each of the past two reunions, comments made leaned toward, "best one ever". It takes members who care to continually reach that level of appreciation.

In another article, John Acomb mentions that we have 538 paid memberships. At this same time last year, that number stood at 645. In 2003, we had 746. Where are you? Please do as John asks and look at your newsletter label for the year to which you are paid. If behind, please send in your \$10.00 dues now. We need and want you back on our membership roster.

This past year has seen some good changes and some difficult moments. The loss of our beloved Jack Mitchell was a hard blow from which to recover. Even in our sadness, we know he is watching us from above, and smiling when something goes right. Allow me to share one such insight of my own from this past January. One of Jack's major concerns when I took on memorabilia preservation was to locate the college seal, which had finally been returned to us from The Way. After a lot of negotiating and letter writing by many, Lyle Hilbert was able to obtain the seal. In a 1983 letter that I found, he indicated that he had it in his basement. After his death, we were unable to locate any of his personal effects and thought the seal to once again be lost to us.

For the past year, I've included the seal search in my journey through the college's history. In 1983, Price Lewis signed a gift agreement with the Lyon County Historical Society and included in the listing of donations was "one college seal". However, all attempts to locate said seal were in vain. That is until January 14, 2010.

I was in the "bat cave" of the Lyon Co. Museum, (which one must experience to believe), and there, setting on a shelf in front of me, was a seal. When I say I was near speechless, I do not exaggerate. As I cradled the seal in my hands, the curator said "Is that what you've been looking for? It's been on my desk forever, and I didn't know what it was." I handed it to her, asking her to use it on a piece of paper so I could be certain it

was the right seal and, it was. I was so excited and anyone who knows me well can only imagine how my mind was swirling. Back to Jack and his watching us as good things happen to those who wait. I told Maxine about finding the seal when I saw her the next morning, and she laughed and said, "I know Jack is smiling down on you right now". I really believed her at that moment.

Where is this going you might be asking? It is one more absolute joy I've experienced in this project of preserving our history through our memorabilia collections. This past year has been one of the most rewarding of my life, and I am so grateful to our board for granting my request to take it all on. Jan Spencer gave me, with Sharon Spencer Stewart's blessing, Margaret Patton Spencer's vast collection of C of E history, photos, and souvenirs kept from the 1920s to her death. It has been a delight to discover original correspondence and documents from the late 1800s and to learn more history of our college than I ever imagined possible.

There is one other point. Some of us are getting to the time in our lives when we find that we are "downsizing". If you are in that situation and have any items relating to your time at C of E that you are ready to part with, please bring them with you to the reunion and donate them to your alumni association. Someone in the memorabilia room will accept the donation and give you a receipt. Identified photographs will be greatly appreciated.

When I say the Association is in good shape, I truly believe we are and that we will continue to thrive and yes, hopefully, to grow in membership numbers. The day will come when we are all gone; but I know in my heart the college will live on through our scholarships, and our collections.

Negro Leagues Baseball Museum, (<http://www.nlbm.com>), is dedicated to preserving the rich history of African-American Baseball. Experience a tour of multi-media displays, hundreds of photographs and a variety of artifacts dating from the late 1800s through the 1960's.

Nelson-Atkins Museum of Art, <http://www.nelson-atkins.org> The Nelson is especially noted for its Asian art, including Tang dynasty bowls and Ming dynasty furniture; an outdoor sculpture garden with the largest U.S. collection of bronzes by Henry Moore; one of the country's largest collections of American photography; the largest public collection of works by Missouri native Thomas Hart Benton; a collection of 17th- and 18th-century European paintings; Impressionist and post-Impressionist pieces; and American art. The museum includes works by Caravaggio, Titian, Rembrandt, Renoir, Monet, Picasso, Gauguin, van Gogh, Andy Warhol, and Willem de Kooning. Plan on 2 hours or more here.

Della H. (Clements) Mitchell, A36, of Estes Park, CO, passed away July 27, 2009, at age 95. Her husband Clarence predeceased her. Two sons survive her.

Dr. William Meeker Fuson, X36, of Richmond, IN, died July 16, 2009, at age 93. After leaving C of E, Bill went to the University of Kansas where he received both his A.B. and M.A. degrees. Subsequently he received his Ph.D. in sociology from the University of Wisconsin. His career was devoted to being a college sociology professor. Most of his tenure was at Earlham College. His wife, **Helen (Finley) Fuson, A34**, and two brothers, **Ben Fuson, A34**, and **C. Nelson Fuson, A34**, predeceased him. Four children, eight grandchildren and two great-grandchildren survive him. Also surviving are cousins **Ben Meeker, A34**, and **Mary (Meeker) Wilson, X35**.

Genevieve (Stewart) Hall, A39, of Hamilton, MT, passed away on August 9, 2009, at age 92. Her husband, **Arthur (Art) Hall, A37**, predeceased her. He died March 9, 2003. A daughter, two sons and six grandchildren survive Genevieve.

(Jack) Chaney, predeceased her. A granddaughter and three great grandchildren survive her.

Kenneth L. Regenold, X42, of Osage City, KS, died September 8, 2009, at age 89. Ken played football at C of E. He left college to serve in the Army Air Corps during World War II. After his military service he attended the University of Kansas and graduated with a degree in electrical engineering. His entire career was as an electrical engineer with Westinghouse. He retired in 1985 and moved back to his family's farm in 1989. His wife predeceased him. A stepdaughter, a sister and a step grandson survive him.

Dorothy Edna (Wilson) Slentz, A43, passed away September 24, 2009, at age 89 in Nashville, TN. While attending C of E, Dorothy was Vice-President

of her junior class and a member of the Quill Club. She and her future husband, **Edwin Lawrence Slentz, M.D., A43**, were King and Queen of Hearts their junior year. Edwin predeceased her in 2006 after 62 years of marriage. Her brother, **David Wilson, X44**, another brother and a daughter also predeceased her. Four children and seven grandchildren survive her.

Charles Wiedman, X44, of Kiowa, KS, died on October 24, 2009, at age 87. He was a medic and surgery tech in the Army in World War II. He was captured in the Battle of the Ardennes. He was a prisoner of war until May 1945. He lived most of his life in Kiowa where he worked various jobs. His wife, Nola, a daughter and two sisters survive him.

Eugene S. Kobylinski, A49, of Tonawanda, NY, passed away April 27, 2009, at age 84. He married **Barbara Weesner, A50**, who survives, as well as a daughter and a son.

Francis J. Fuchs, A51, of Camarillo, CA, died March 3, 2006. He was born August 5, 1926. No further information is available.

Ray H. Morey, A51, died a hero at age 79 on February 19, 2009. Ray was a resident of the Leisure World retirement community in Seal Beach, CA, where a fierce fire broke out on February 17, 2009. Six units, including Morey's, were destroyed in a three-alarm blaze that required 65 firefighters to extinguish. Despite his own serious injuries, Ray alerted all of his neighbors to the fire. All got out without injury. Morey, however, did not survive his injuries. Ray came to C of E from California. He was an excellent football player. After college he served as a surveyor in the Army during the Korean War. Subsequently he embarked on a lifelong career of high school teaching and coaching in California. His wife, Pat, predeceased him. Three children and three grandchildren survive him.

Robert R. "Bob" Swedberg, A53, of Odessa, TX, passed away in June 2007. He was an accountant who spent his career in the petroleum industry. His wife, **Kathryn Fern "Katy" (Dehlinger) Swedberg, A50**, and a son predeceased him. In a recent letter, Bob's daughter describes her parents as "proud graduates of the College of Emporia." His daughter, five grandchildren, five great-grandchildren, a brother-in-law, **Charles Dehlinger, A55**, and a sister-in-law, **Ernestine (Dehlinger) Nibarger, X53**, survived him. Note: Ernestine Nibarger passed away in August 2009.

A black wreath was placed on the front of the engine. At Enterprise the procession continued by car to the cemetery, where a Dixieland brass band provided a New Orleans-style dirge. His ashes, wrapped in one of his flannel shirts, were buried near his pioneer forbearers. His wife, a daughter, and a sister, **Alice Anne Schmidt, A55**, survive Fred.
